He's got his own mind. to learn more, in the speed that the world requires. average genera: from sex to money to food: tame our primordial instinct, from terry burnham and jay phelan. new york: basic, 2012. pp.S/b 16.99. is evolutionary theory useful in the context of our daily life? the second edition of mean genes by terry burnham and jay phelan is written as a Darwinian self-help book for what we all hate every day: our minds and our bodies. the authors begin with the general premise that evolutionary thought can inform all sectors of the scientific investigation. in the four sections of the following book, they oate this hypothesis to explain the annoying but constant struggles that persist in our lives. the book draws rational from psychology and evolutionary behavior to justify our attitudes towards debt, fat, drugs, risk, greed, gender, beauty, infidelity, family and friends/foes. each subject is framed as a problem we face in everyday life, documented with the evidence of the published anthropological, behavioral and psychological literature, as well as examples of popular culture and personal anecdotes. Although the title may be reminiscent of richard Dawkins' autoastro gene [(1976.)) burnham and phelan rely less on a rigorous interpretation of evolutionary theory and more on telling a funny narrative to describe and provide a resolution for complex and multifaceted problems with which we are all intimately familiar. the first edition of mean genes was published more than a decade ago. the second edition is completed by comment at the beginning of each section and by general reflections in a preface and at the conclusion. these additions discusscontemporary social and cultural context of the book. For example, the preface of "Thin wallets and fat bodies" includes updated 2010 statistics for the incidence of obesity in the United States to document the continued relevance of their arguments since the first edition (p. 15). www.meangenes.org's website offers a "Note and Search" section with footnotes for sometimes vague or oblique references in the text. quotes, figures and links to complete resources are organized by section and page number in the book, although this resource has not been updated to reflect the page numbers added and edited for the second edition. the main text of mean genes is an easy and fun reading. topics cover the breadth of human vices and probably keep readers involved. the dialogue narrative will certainly deepen the understanding of a reader of human beings who, in evolutionary time, are subject to the pressures of natural selection. These historical selective pressures range from those common to all organisms (a need to consume calories) to those relegated to complex social systems (a need to develop cooperative systems), less explicitly stated is that the selection still acts on human populations, although this phenomenon is occasionally mentioned in passing. as a class text, there are several useful topics in genes mean that would allow students a meta-level perspective on their learning, embedded throughout the text are insightshuman behavior, including how we learn and process data. The risk chapter, for example, discusses the difficulty we have with the probability of understanding (p. 109.) which incorporates the most practical learning. Finding these useful applications is challenging, as the main conclusions highlighted in Mean Genes are related to general ways of thinking to improve our lives. Moreover, the assumptions about the social context of the topics presented throughout the book can be alienating in some public. The current generation of high school or college students can find some popular cultural references dated and not familiar. In the preface to the section on Romance and Reproduction, Burnham and Phelan were pondered if their analysis of gender differences remains valid (pp. 145–49). In addition, the Genere chapter (pp. 151–171) conflates "girls against boys" with sexuality issues. Although connected, sex/sex and sexuality are distinct phenomena with differential interpretations in an evolutionary context. Given the controversy that continues to surround the genre, it is not surprising that this section is clearly rare on the recommendations to welcome the disparity between males and females. Sometimes, the prose of Mean Genes detracts from the main points that authors try to convey. While describing systems of infidelity and breeding, the authors say "scientists with small scalpels and psyche slightly absurd can perform vasectomies on birds" (p. 195).The authors use personal anecdotes and self-depreciation to measure the comical representations of scientists, repeated events can banalize the utility of basic research of science. Moreover, the desire to appeal the language sometimes obscures the shade of the prose. Despite the design of primary literature, the main topics in the book are largely untested hypotheses. It would be interesting to use Mean Genes to promote a discussion on how to relate and balance different types of scientific evidence and whether they support the assumptions of overarching. The most worrying effect of Mean Gene's arguments, however, is the reduction of widely dispersed types of research and examples to "right-so" evolutionary stories. This problem is commonly encountered by colloquial descriptions of evolution, but is particularly prolific in attempts to justify human behavior with evolutionary reasoning. In fact, the roles of genetic determinism and adaptation are commonly confounded in the analyses that invoke evolutionary psychology (Confer et al. [2010]). Mean Genes constantly confuses this problem by attempting to describe human behavior to genetic predisposition, despite the design of different types of empirical research that do not always take genes are involved. This mixing of assumptions can perpetuate a number of wrong ideas on the process of science. Mean Genes is not a book from which to learn evolutionary theory. Biology classes instructors can find more appropriateo involve students' interest in psychology, behavior and human evolution. Regardless, the book includes interesting hypotheses that can serve as thought experiments for the application of evolutionary thought, so that instructors of courses of psychology or humanity can find the applicable book. The competence of the authors combines different perspectives: Phelan is a biologist, Burnham an economist. Rather than strictly reporting primary research and results, writing and book analysis provide an example of the use of science as a world vision and ways of thinking. After reading the book, take another look at the preface (pp. ix-xvii). The authors are well aware of the controversial nature of their claims, as well as the arguments of their opponents. Mean Genes' main attraction is "the first Darwinian self-improvement book" (p. xiv). The reflection of the council in this book depends on the acceptance of the effects of evolution on human beings, appreciation for basic science, the desire to think about the broader context of our behavior. In learning to see our daily habits and behaviors in a different light, perhaps we can better manage the conflict between the history of human evolution and the evidence of modern society.
